OUR SERVICES: BEYOND THE BED

IVSN's "Beyond the Bed" model combines shelter/housing with comprehensive services that enable homeless families and individuals to rapidly return to permanent housing and self-sufficiency.

- Provides supportive services beyond shelter, coordinated by experienced case managers
- Workshops for gaining employment, such as resume writing, interview skills, and networking
- Focus on financial literacy; clients must save a minimum of 50% of their income
- Emphasizes education, self-discipline, strong work ethic, and healthy lifestyles



OUR IMPACT: HIGH QUALITY RESULTS

- Over 90% of transitional program graduates return to permanent housing and self-sufficiency
- Average length of stay is 150 days in transitional shelter—far less than the national average of 232 days
- Families save an average of \$2,000 while in the transitional housing program
